### LITTLE WANDLE BOOKS (PHONICS)

Can we please be extra careful to look after our Little Wandle phonics scheme books. So far in the 3 half terms it has been running, we have 45 books which have either been torn or water damaged. Whilst we hugely appreciate the value of a physical book, we are monitoring this to see whether it is sustainable to send books home as this would cost school £450 a year just to replace these. If we can be mindful not to put the books in with water bottles hopefully the number of unusable books will decrease and we can continue to send physical books home, rather then revert to an online system.

Earlier this year we held an informal drop in

session for parents to join us for a drink, some cake and to give us some feedback. Overall this was a hugely helpful event and has supported us in reflecting on our current tools for communication.
