aware that the issue of term-time holidays is a divisive one and can be the cause of bad feeling between home and school. At the moment, the national statistics for overall school absence is 7.5% and 24.2% of pupils nationally being classes as 'persistently absent' (10% or more of schooling missed). All schools are under huge scrutiny and the discretion we can exercise in authorising any withdrawal from learning requests is significantly reduced. In general, exceptional circumstances are based on, but not completely limited to: completely unavoidable / unforeseen circumstances, attendance of a religious or significant family event such as a wedding or a funeral (for which only the actual event is authorised and in very rare circumstances 1 transportation day), certain medical circumstances or additional exceptional circumstances which are considered on a case-by-case basis. Personally, I think it is horrendous that the travel industry charges so much more for term-time holidays but I just wanted to share where school stood to try and avoid any families taking it personally when we are unable to authorise holidays. Even in the case where family members have jobs where they might only be able to book a term-time holiday, as a school we are still expected to be the ambassador for education and prioritise pupil attendance. Please also be aware, that any fines are by the local authority and school does not financially benefit at all.

SWIMMING AT BERRY HILL Contrary to a few rumours, we are not building

a swimming pool at school, as such.... What we are doing though, is having a temporary one built on site, within a marquee, so that we can provide swimming lessons for the 3 weeks prior to the Easter break. The company we are using can run up to 11 ½-hour lessons a day and they provide us with 2 qualified swimming instructors / lifeguards. It eats so much into children's timetables to be transported down to a swimming pool and get back - this typically takes 2 hours out of the day, so this year we are trying something different. Exactly which year groups will be involved in lessons will be sorted much nearer the time.

CLUBS AT BERRY HILL Following some feedback, we are changing how we allocate

places for our after-school clubs. We are in the process of trying to offer a richer and broader range of clubs and will be writing to you soon. When the clubs are open for signup, the chance to register your interest will be open to parents for 2 days.
