- Black or navy shorts / tracksuit bottoms / leggings
- Plain black or navy tracksuit top / hoodie / sweatshirt
- Suitable PE footwear (e.g. PE plimsols or laced / Velcro non-high-top trainers)
- No earrings\* (ideally these are not worn at all on PE days)
- Long hair needs to be tied up please.

\*Regarding earrings – if there is a medical reason why earrings cannot be removed, please speak to me and I will consider if an exception can be made to our no tape policy. If a pupil does wear tape, it is the responsibility of the professional leading the session to continually check that it is safe so I hope everyone can understand why tape will only be allowed in exceptional circumstances so as not to slow down and disrupt everyone's PE lessons.
