



Remote Learning Policy for School Closures

Purpose

This policy explains how learning will continue when school is closed due to weather (such as snow days) or other unexpected events. Our goal is to provide continuity of learning while keeping expectations clear and manageable for families.

When This Policy Is Used

The Remote Learning Policy will be invoked when the school is officially closed due to snow/severe weather or emergency situations that prevent in-person attendance. Families will be notified of school closures through ClassDojo.

What Families Can Expect from School

- Teachers will post remote learning links and instructions on ClassDojo by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the closure.
- Learning activities will be reasonable in length and appropriate for children to complete at home.
- When school reopens, teachers will review the remote learning assignments with children to reinforce understanding.

What Is Expected from Children

- Children are expected to complete the assigned learning activities on the day of the closure.
- Any written work or answers to questions should be completed on paper, not digitally unless otherwise directed.
- Children must bring all completed written work and notes back to school on the day school reopens.
- Children should do their best to complete the work independently.
- In addition to the set learning activities, children are expected to complete their regular reading, spelling practice, and times tables while the school is closed.
